

# Pinnacle Orthopaedics <u>Carpal/Cubital Tunnel Release</u> Discharge Instructions

## **General Anesthesia**

- Do not drive or operate machinery for at least 24 hours
- Do not consume alcohol, tranquilizers, sleeping medications, or any non-prescribed medication for at least 48 hours
- You may need someone to go home with you tonight.

#### **Activity**

- You are advised to go directly home from the hospital. Restrict your activities and rest for the day. Resume light to normal activity tomorrow.
- Move your fingers as instructed to minimize scar tissue.
- Splint per Protocol Velcro splint to be used 24/7 other than shower time.

#### Fluids and Diet

- Begin with clear liquids, bullion, dry toast, soda crackers. If not nauseated, you may go to a regular diet when you desire.
- Greasy and spicy foods are not advised for today.

#### Medications

- Take over the counter medications such as Tylenol, Motrin, Aleve (unless contra-indicated) to help reduce postoperative pain and swelling
- Do not drink alcohol or drive when you are taking these medications
- You may resume your daily prescription medication schedule

## Operative site/ Procedure

- Keep dressing clean and dry
- May remove dressings in 2 days and then re-dress with bandaids after showering and replace splint to the wrist.
- May wash over the incision with soap and water in the shower in 2 days.
- NO BATHS, NO SOAKS, NO HOT TUBS!!, place a new bandage/bandaid over the operative site after showering.

### **Extremities: Arms, Hands, Legs and Feet**

- Keep operative extremity elevated as much as possible to lessen swelling and discomfort
- Ice to operative site
- Non-weight bearing to the operative extremity

## Normal signs/ Symptoms post procedure

- "Feelings" of tiredness/mild disorientation

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- "Feelings" of nausea or lack of appetite may also experience some minor episodes of vomiting
- "Feelings" of soreness/discomfort/pain, which should be relieved by medication
- "Feelings" of numbness or tingling may last for an acceptable period, depending on your surgical procedure
- "Normal" to have small amounts of drainage at the incision site
- "Normal" for the operative site to appear slightly swollen and pink.
